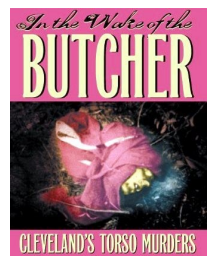


The Car Show will be on Main Street, rendering downtown Coudersport a scene out of the Roaring '20s to all visitors who come.

WEEKLY NESS FACTOIDS

One of the most fascinating cases in Eliot Ness's crimefighting career was a serial killer, nicknamed "The Mad Butcher," who terrorized Cleveland. At least 13 deaths were attributed to the murderer, who dismembered his victims and was never brought to justice. It's actually still buried in the city's cold case files. This fascinating episode in Eliot's life will be the focus of a program at the Coudersport Theatre on the evening of July 20.
